As members of the SignGram's Work Group 3"Semantics, we –Jette Hedegaard Kristoffersen and Andrea Lackner – will cooperate and actively work on specific COST-Action tasks for the Blueprint Grammar that were distributed within the group: writing and revising sample chapters for the blue print manual.

The main task of the week is to work on two concrete sections of the Blueprint and to discuss elicitation materials and methodological approaches and challenges for identifying semantic categories in sign languages.

The expected outputs are sample chapters for the blueprint manual on Tense (WG3 manual 1.2) and on Turn taking (WG3 manual 2.8.2).

Before the beginning of the STSM we will write first draft of the two chapters, and during my STSM we will fulfill the revising task on both chapters, complement the drafts with examples and elicitation methods and guidelines and write the final chapters to be presented at WG3's meeting in Venice in May 14.

Secondly, we will compare research done on Austrian Sign Language (ÖGS) and on Danish Sign Language (DTS) with respect to tense and turn-taking. This is interesting for future collaborations and individual research projects of the participants, but is also relevant for the development of the sample chapters for the blueprint.

Furthermore, I will be participating in Workshop on a cross-linguistic comparison of linguistic functions coded by non-manuals in sign languages arranged by the Centre for Sign Language and Deaf Communication (ZGH), Alpen-Adria-University Klagenfurt. The workshop is an interactive workshop and Andrea Lackner and I will contribute with input and brief presentations to the workshop discussing that addresses methodological approaches which are used by a researchers for identifying non-manuals in sign languages. The participation in this workshop will give us opportunities to discuss the efficiency and inefficiency, the advantages and disadvantages of a methodological approach e.g. in identifying sematic categories with other COST-Action members and sign language linguists.

Finally we will summarize the results of the COST-tasks, so that it can be presented at the next COST-Action meetinginVenice2014.
